

Family Futures is a nonprofit agency located in downtown Grand Rapids, Michigan at the Riverview Center. For more than 30 years, Family Futures has worked to shape a community where all children are supported to reach their full potential. Our internship program is highly developed and well-regarded in the community for our dedication to professional development and opportunities for hands-on experience.

- **Biostatistics (1):** For a biostatistics graduate student to gain experience analyzing large data-sets to determine trends, interpreting significance in data, and identifying correlations and potential causations related to early childhood research.
- **Business Intelligence (1):** Support the technological infrastructure of the agency through a unique combination of business and computer science skills and work directly with the BI team.
- **Campaign Support (2):** Support a campaign for a potential Kent County children's millage and learn about local politics.
- **Childhood Development (4):** Support the Connections program through data entry, processing Ages and Stages Questionnaires, and supporting families with community resources and referrals. Learn about child development, quality improvement projects and an opportunity to shadow a parent coach.
- **Fund Development (1):** Work with our resource team to develop and implement fundraising efforts, gaining experience in fundraising, research, and maintaining a donor database.
- **Interdisciplinary (1):** A project-based opportunity that allows for cross-departmental experience. It is highly flexible and requires a significant amount of independence. Examples include data analysis, research, and program improvement. This position is typically reserved for graduate students.
- **Marketing (1):** Gain experience in social media support, event planning, brand management, print design, web content editing, copywriting, public relations, and project management.
- **Masters of Social Work (1):** A field placement opportunity for an MSW student interested in macro level social work, with opportunities for shadowing case management via our parent coaching and home visiting services. Focus on community organizing, early childhood advocacy, adverse childhood experiences prevention, social service program development, and violence prevention.
- **Neurodevelopment (1):** For a graduate student interested in childhood and youth brain development.
- **Nonprofit Accounting (1):** Gain experience in accounts payable, accounts receivable, payroll, bookkeeping, computer skills, and possibly program specific budgeting and report preparation.
- **Nonprofit Administration (1):** Gain experience in a leadership position, where skills like time management, community collaboration, project management, and organization are key.
- **Program Engagement (1):** Work in a diverse early childhood environment, sharing time between Early Learning Neighborhood Collaborative (ELNC) and Family Futures' Connections program, focusing on parent engagement, planning fun family events, and program coordination.
- **Social Services Program Administration (1):** Gain practical experience in the area of social work program management by working with Healthy Families.
- **Special Events (1):** Gain experience in hospitality, event planning, and community outreach.
- **Volunteer Services (2):** Gain knowledge and experience in nonprofit work with volunteer management best practices, relationship building, and project coordination.
